- Are you free to leave and come and go as you wish?
- Are you unpaid, paid little, or paid only through tips?
- Do you work extremely long and/or unusual hours?
- Are you not allowed breaks or suffer under terrible conditions at work?
- Do you owe a large debt and cannot pay it off?
- Were you recruited under false promises about the job and conditions of the work?
- Do you live at your place of employment?
- Does someone else keep your personal identification, travel documents, money, financial records, and bank account?
- Do you have few or no personal property?
- Are you told you will be deported if you do not keep working?
- Are you afraid to tell anyone what is happening or get help?
