




# PALM ISLES

# Get to know our Volunteer CLINTON "CJ" STITES



Volunteer **Clinton** "**CJ**" **Stites** was recently named *Captain of the Volunteer Marine Unit* (*VMU*). CJ has had some interesting adventures prior to becoming a PBSO volunteer, and we'd like to tell you about some of them.



CJ was born and raised in New Jersey, and after high school, he enlisted in the Coast Guard. He spent four years as a Petty Officer, some of it in Intelligence.





After being discharged, he became a police officer in Bridgeport, Connecticut. Because of his background in intelligence work, he was given a deep undercover assignment, such that no one in his community knew he was an officer.

One kind of undercover assignment was to search for muggers by pretending to be an elderly woman.



After his time with the undercover unit, CJ was asked to be the Department's "Officer Friendly" on a motorcycle, visiting schools, shut-ins, sick

children in hospitals, and such. CJ was accompanied on these visits by his partner, "Safety Sam," a stuffed cartoon character to whom children could relate.






During his time with Bridgeport PD, CJ also spent time with the Emergency Services Unit and was Commander of the Dive Team.

In Florida, they built a super-modified 2007 Corvette, with engine and body modifications, and ended up winning 40 trophies on both the Atlantic and Gulf Coasts.

Eventually, family reasons led them to move across the state to Palm Beach County. After three years here, CJ ran into an existing volunteer in a gym, and got recruited for the VMU. In his third year with us, he has recently become the Unit's Captain, while Beth keeps busy as a volunteer in pet rescue.

### CJ received an ABCD award in May. His nomination reads:

We would like to take this opportunity to nominate Captain Stites for an ABCD Award. His more than 30 years of professional maritime experience with the U.S. Coast Guard, EMT, and many years as a maritime police officer, has added much to many areas.

- 1. He has personally updated and donated new safety equipment to all the boats.
- 2. He has donated countless hours of his time developing new training techniques to improve the Unit's performance, which will benefit the public and the Sheriff's Marine Department.
- 3. During the 17 months of 10-7, due to the COVID-19 epidemic, he personally ensured that all equipment, vehicles, and boats were maintained in an operational manner when the Unit returned to 10-8 status.
- 4. During the COVID shutdown, he maintained contact with members of the Unit, checking on their health, and their family's health, which kept the morale and mental health of the members on a high note.
- 5. He has now delegated trained personnel to develop procedures for training of all existing and new members on the saltwater boats, and the freshwater lake boats.

For these outstanding achievements, positive attitude, and dedication, we want to nominate Captain Stites for the ABCD Award.

P.S. For those of you who are wondering whatever happened to CJ's partner, Safety Sam, we have this update for you. Sam also moved to Florida, and was able recently to put on a life jacket and join CJ in speaking to children about boating safety.
